- Alvarado** - \$500 awarded to a Hudson MS 8th grade upon senior graduation (Special Ed or ESL).
- America's Credit Union** – \$1,000-one per high school, GPA of 3.0 or better.
- Badough/Metts** - \$500, any teacher/librarian working on library certification/degree.
- Beverly Boehl** – \$1,000, NGHS senior.
- Elena Brooks Cox** - \$500, African-American senior pursuing education at Historical Black College/University.
- Jan Burlison** - \$400, teacher in GISD.
- Lucy Clark-Dunkin Donuts** - \$500, GHS senior.
- Coca Cola** – up to \$500 as funds are available, one per high school; 2011 last of funds will be used as follows: \$275/high school and one at \$289+ for Memorial Pathway to deplete funds.
- Norma & Scott Dorsey** - \$600, career in Education or Journalism.
- Dveirin** – Jackson MS, to defray costs of 7th grade field trip to Dallas Holocaust Museum and/or the Annual Dveirin Act of Kindness Award to a 7th grade student.
- Don Harbin** – funds vary, for special education students eligible to enroll in post secondary programs, and/or demonstrate a need for items to assist in achieving post secondary goal.

- Health Science Technology** – funds vary (usually around \$750), must be in Health Science Technology course and HOSA member.
- Betsy Henderson** – funds vary when donations are made, programs to benefit Fine Arts.
- Jim Henderson** - \$500, GHS senior pursuing a career related to choral music .

- Gene Hudson** - \$500, NGHS senior pursuing education.
- Bill Hunt** - \$3,000, GHS senior.
- Jacob** - \$1,000, NGHS senior with an overall grade point average of a “B,” demonstrate financial need, and participates in at least one school-sponsored activity.
- LCHS Kasparian** - \$1,000, LCHS senior and participated in the Law Magnet Program for two years
- LCHS Principal Achievement** – award four \$500, LCHS senior.
- LCHS Ready, Set, Teach** – \$1,000, LCHS senior who has completed Ready, Set, Teach I or II and majoring in education, no more than 5 excused absences, has active participation/desire to teach on and off campus, and putting forth an attitude of “going the extra mile.”
- LCHS Stephen Whitlow Classical Magnet** – \$1,000, LCHS senior who has completed 3 years in dance, piano, or latin magnet.
- LCHS Television Magnet** - \$1,000, LCHS senior who has spent four years in the LC Television Magnet.
- LCHS College & Career** - \$1,000, LCHS senior who has excelled in one of LCHS's magnet programs and is enrolled in a two-year or four-year college or university.
- Patricia Leeman** - \$300 & \$250+, (depleting with 2011 graduates) giving five students \$350 and one student will receive \$250+ (remaining) from GHS. Students must be attending a local community college and pursuing a degree in Education.
- George Lyons** - \$250, NFHS senior in the horticulture program.
- Memorial Middle School** – (formerly MCI, New Hope, & Davidson—now combined) 8th grader who has maintained a B average first through fifth six weeks, writes a 200 word essay, recommendation letters, volunteered 24 hrs. in a community service activity/project, and maintained a B average in grades 9-12.

School Nurse – not to exceed \$300, for a school nurse reimbursement of registration fees of state and national conferences, NBCSN exam, or college courses for a BSN or Masters degree.

Laura Selby Memorial - \$1,000, SGHS senior based on overall excellence in academics, leadership, and activities.

Shubzda - \$4,000, NFHS senior who exemplifies excellence overall, participated in extracurricular activities, leadership, & academic skills, and two recommendation letters.

Jack Shugart - \$500, graduating senior pursuing a degree from Texas A&M.

Jill Shugart - \$500, graduating senior pursuing a degree in Education.

Swartz and Smith Memorial - \$250, awarding two graduating seniors who has spent at least two years in the art program.

TEST Prep – varies, funding for students to take the SAT Saturday Prep class.

Wycoff Arnold - \$1,000, female NFHS student who participated in girls athletics in any capacity
